## Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Breast cancer is a malignant (cancer) tumor that starts from cells of the breast. It is found mostly in women, but men can get breast cancer also. It is expected that 1,990 men and 182,460 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year.

So far nothing has been proven to prevent every case of cancer, but there are early detection tests to improve the odds that it will be found at an early stage when it is easier to treat. Also performing a self breast exam every month can help find lumps early.

You may know someone with breast cancer, and may wonder whether you too, will be affected during your lifetime. Right now though, we just don't know enough about what causes breast cancer and we haven't yet figured out how to keep it from happening. That's why it is important to keep breast cancer research and awareness alive and growing; and hopefully one day we will find a cure.

## Homemade Salad Dressing



- 3 Egg yolks
- 1/2 Cup vinegar
- 1/4 Cup white granulated sugar (or sugar substitute)
- 1/2 Cup milk
- 1 Tbsp. mustard seed
- 1/8 tsp. salt

Put all ingredients in pan and cook on medium heat until thick. Remove from burner and use wire whisk for about a minute to mix well. Allow to cool and use on tossed salad, potato salad, or coleslaw. Will keep up to two weeks in the refrigerator.
